### Holloway becomes new Executive Director of DIAA

On November 15, 2002, Jack Holloway resigned from his NWCA position as Assistant to the Executive Director of Scholastic Affairs to pursue a new career as the Executive Director of the Delaware Interscholastic Athletic Association.

Jack brought 34 years of combined experience as a high school wrestling coach and athletic director (at William Penn HS) to the NWCA. Jack Holloway originally served as the scholastic director of the NWCA from 1998 to 2001. In September, 2001, he relinquished this position to accept the part time staff position of Assistant to the Executive Director for Scholastic Affairs. During his tenure with the NWCA, Jack worked tirelessly to help

establish several vital NWCA scholastic initiatives:

- Secured a significant grant to relocate the Brute/US Open and Scholastic Duals to the University of Delaware.

- Influenced Delaware and several other state high school athletic associations to adopt the NWCA Weight Certification Program.

- Positioned University of Delaware to serve as host for the 2003 NWCA All Star Classic in an effort to restore intercollegiate wrestling at Univ. of Delaware.

- Served as a key consultant in the establishment of the USMC Building Leaders for Life Program. He gained approval from his school district to be the first pilot program.

- Bolstered the scholastic state chairman infrastructure of the NWCA.

The NWCA will be forever grateful for Jack Holloway's leadership through this incredible period of growth for the scholastic arm of our association.

### NWCA/DWA US High School Open and Scholastic Duals set for April 4-6, 2003

The National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA) and the Delaware Wrestling Alliance (DWA) through the sponsorship of **Brute**, will be hosting the second annual **NWCA/DWA US High School Open and Scholastic Duals** April 4-6, 2003, at the Bob Carpenter Center on the campus of the University of Delaware. This USA Wrestling sanctioned event will again bring together one of the nation's most successful underclassman team tournaments with the US High School Open.

The scholastic duals, which is entering its ninth year, is a showcase for upcoming talent as no seniors are allowed to compete in this state versus state, folkstyle dual meet competition. The talent for this event grows each year as evidenced by last year's championship field that included 195 state place finishers, 88 state finalists, 58 State Champions and National Prep Champions. This year's competition field should be even more intense as the team field will be increased to 24 state teams.

The US High School Open enters its second year after a successful inaugural tournament. Nearly 300 wrestlers competed in last year's event including over 50 state champions. This event creates an opportunity for thousands of outstanding wrestlers across the country to compete against the nation's best and to earn US High School Open All-American Honors.
