## 2007 National Collegiate Wrestling Championships and Convention Special 10-Year Anniversary Event

**D**allas, Texas -- March 8-10, 2007

The National Collegiate Wrestling Championships and Convention held at the brand new state-of-the-art Garland Special Events Center in Dallas, Texas attracted fans from all over the country to watch many of the best college athletes in the country. Over 300 athletes from nearly 70 colleges and universities qualified to make the trip to Dallas culled from seven Conference Championships held in New York, Virginia, Florida, Colorado, Michigan, California, and Washington.

This year marked the 10-year anniversary of the Championships and the National Collegiate Wrestling Association. The NCWA teamed up with various local and national organizations to make for an entertaining three days of championship wrestling and wrestling related events.

### Grand Valley State Lakers capture Second Consecutive Team Title

Grand Valley State won its second consecutive National Championship and fourth in seven years.

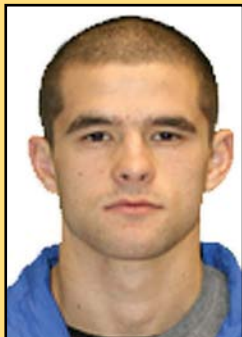
Joe Mendez (133 lbs) and Billy Johnson (165 lbs) led their team to victory with each earning individual National Championship titles. Led by new head coach, Rick Bolhuis, the Lakers outdistanced second place finisher, The University of Central Florida, by forty-five points.

In addition to Mendez and Johnson's individual titles, GVSU's John Aikens (197 lbs) claimed a second place finish and Dan Schaaf (125), Anthony Ferguson (184) and Kelvin Miller (235) each claimed a third place finish. In all, GVSU's star-studded team produced thirteen All-Americans, including Nicholas Emery (125), Kyle Shank and Chris Eggleston (both at 141), Adam Ortiz and Travis Eisen (both at 149), Russell Correll (157) and Michael Paul (174).

Grand Valley State, located in Allendale, Michigan, entered the National Championships as the favorite after winning their eighth consecutive NCWA North Central Regional Team Championship and qualified 22 wrestlers out of a possible 22 for the National Championships.



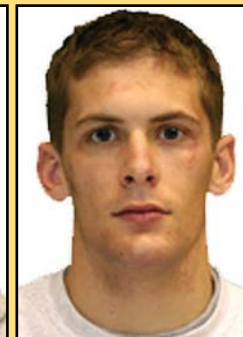

## Marion Military's Cee Jay Hamilton named Most Outstanding Wrestler

Freshman, Cee Jay Hamilton was named the Most Outstanding Wrestler at the NCWA National Championships, after capturing the 125-pound National title. Hamilton, coached by wrestling legends James and David Hazewinkel, walked through the tournament with 2 tech-falls and 3 major decisions, defeating Central Florida's Federico Carosio in the finals by a major decision 12-2. This win also helped earn his team a 5th place finish.

After building a nationally ranked wrestling program at Pensacola Christian College, Two-Time Olympic Wrestlers James and David Hazewinkel took the coaching position at Marion Military Institute (MMI) Wrestling Program this year. Their past record of 11 winning seasons, 5 conference titles, 6 national championships, 8 individual NCWA National Championships, and an impressive 45 NCWA All-Americans has certainly carried over to the MMI program and is raising the team to the next level with their first-ever National Champions.

Four of the eight qualifying Marion Military wrestlers earned All-American honors. They are Champions Zach Brewer (149) and Cee-Jay Hamilton (125), James Brenowitz (235) fifth place All-American, and Derrick Miller (165) sixth place All-American.

The coaches were also honored with an induction into the NCWA National Wrestling Hall of Fame (Founder's Club).

## Kansas State's Beau Tillman named Coach of the Year

Beau Tillman was named the NCWA Coach of the Year at the NCWA All American Banquet. Tillman, a 2-time NCWA All-American at 133 pounds and a 3-time Kansas High School State Champion, has taken his personal success lessons learned on the mat and is skillfully applying them to the coaching technique that underpins Kansas States overall success. Under Tillman's coaching direction, Steve Kern (184) became the National Champion for Kansas State by defeating Steve Gerrard of Colorado State in the finals. After pinning four wrestlers to get to the finals, Kern beat Gerrard by decision, 2-0. Kern also became a four-time NCWA All-American, making him only the 14th wrestler in NCWA history to accomplish this feat.

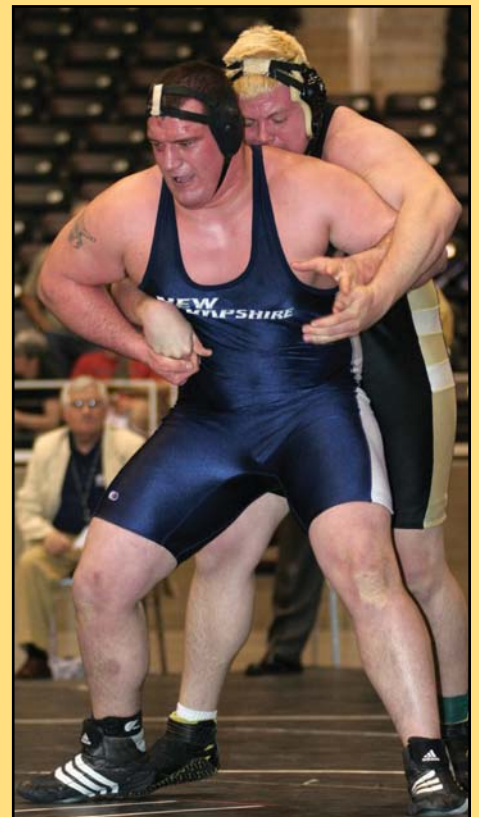
