- **1. MICHIGAN** The tradition-rich University of Michigan wrestling program remains highly-regarded amongst wrestling circles. The list of past superstar performers is seemingly infinite. Previous NCAA champions include Kellen Russell, Steve Luke, Ryan Bertin, Kirk T rost, Mark Chur ella, Jarrett Hubbard, David Porter, Jim Kamman, Jack Bar den, Norvard Nalen, William Courtwright, Donald Nichols, Harold Nichols, Carl Dougovito, and Otto Kelly. Highly successful Head Coach Joe McFarland brings in another prolific recruiting class that ranks as number 1 in the nation. Leading the way are number 1 ranked Dominic Abounader (184) of Ohio, number 1 ranked Adam Coon (285) of Michigan, number 6 ranked Brian Murphy (157) of Illinois, number 9 ranked Geor Fisher (141) of Illinois, number 10 ranked Cameron Kennedy (133) of Illinois, and number 16 ranked Payne Hayden (197) of Michigan. Four other incoming fr eshmen are two-time Michigan state placer Jordan Amine (149), thr ee-time All-Academic selection Ernest Battaglia (157) of Illinois, 2012 Michigan state champion Calderon (157), and Wisconsin state runner-up Ayoola Olapo (184).
- **2. PITTSBURGH** Jason Peters of ficially took over as head coach of the storied University of Pittsbur gh wrestling program in April of 2013, after 10 successful seasons on the Panthers coaching staff as a top assistant. He has a sterling national eputation as a tireless worker and trainer and has been instrumental in helping the Panthers regain its place as one of the finest programs in the country. Peters is poised to add to the list of 1 1 different wrestlers who have won a total of 16 individual NCAA Championships while competing for Pittsbur gh. They include Keith Gavin, Pat Santor Harrison, Larry Lauche, Paul Powell, Ron Schirf, Tom Alberts, Ed Perry, Ed DeWitt, Joe Solomon, and Hugh Perry. Heading this year's tremendous recruiting class are number 1 ranked R yan Solomon (197) of Pennsylvania, number 2 ranked Cody W iercioch (174) of Pennsylvania, number 3 ranked Mikey Racciato (149) of Pennsylvania, number 8 ranked Edgar Bright (149) of Ohio, and number 14 ranked Nick Zanetta (133) of Pennsylvania. Rounding out the list of newcomers ar e Wisconsin state champion Aaron Rothwell (197) and Super 32 Challenge r unner-up Luke Fleck (285) of Pennsylvania.
- **3. VIRGINIA TECH** Head Coach Kevin Dr esser and Associate Head Coach Tony Robie continue to bring in some high-level talent to Blacksburg, Virginia. This year's outstanding class is led by five valiant performers with illustrious backgr ounds and huge expectations. High school stars include number 1 ranked Joey Dance (125) of Virginia, number 3 ranked Kevin Norstr em (141) of

Florida, number 3 ranked Zach Epperly (174) of V irginia, number 6 ranked Dennis Gustafson (133) of V irginia, and number 13 ranked Jared Haught (184) of West Virginia. Two transfer students looking to make an impact ar e two-time V irginia state champion David Wesley (157) and 2012 V irginia state champion David Reck (184). Other new recruits include New Jersey state placer Nick Anderson (133), Illinois state placer Ryan Holzrichter (133), Virginia state placer Jerry Ronnau (141), two-time V irginia Independent School state champion Richard Rumley (141), and National Prep Championships placer Harry Mauk (197).

- **4. MISSOURI** An elite force in the collegiate wr estling scene, the University of Missouri boasts a str ong tradition of excellence both athletically and academically . Former T iger stars include NCAA champions Ben Askren, Mark Ellis, and Maxwell Askren, NCAA runner-ups Shaon Fry and Scott Barker , and multiple All-Americans Khris Whelan, Dave Young, Kenny Liddell, T yron Woodley, Matt Pell, T yler McCormick, Nick Marable, Raymond Jordan, and Dom Bradley . Highly r espected Head Coach Brian Smith brings in an exciting r ecruiting class that is led by number 1 ranked J'Den Cox (285) of Missouri, number 4 ranked B.J. McGhee (125) of Illinois, number 8 ranked B.J. T oal (184) of Ohio, number 9 ranked Joey Lavalle (157) of Nevada, and number 10 ranked Parker Von Egidy (174) of North Car olina. Two exciting transfer students are 2013 National Junior College Championships winner Le'Roy Barnes (133) and 2010 Iowa state champion Mikey England (174).
- **5. OKLAHOMA STATE** Few schools in the country have a history of excellence in any sport as celebrated as the one Oklahoma State University has achieved in wrestling. The list of Cowboy stars is seemingly endless. Names like Kendall Cr oss, John Smith, Ricky Stewart, Eric Guerrero, Doug Blubaugh, Jack VanBebber, Rex Perry, Conrad Caldwell, Ross Flood, Stanley Henson, Joe McDaniel, Buddy Arndt, Earl McCready, Myron Roderick, Richard Hutton, Joe James, Pat Smith, Yojiro Uetake, Tadaaki Hatta, Dwayne Keller, Darrell Keller, Mike Sheets, Jimmy Jackson, Mark Branch, Chris Barnes, Alan Fried, Johnny Thompson, Lee Roy Smith, Kenny Monday , Johny Hendricks, Coleman Scott, Jordan Oliver and a multitude of others became legends in Stillwater during their college car eers. Highlyregarded Head Coach John Smith and top-flight Head Coach Eric Guerrero signed another sterling recruiting class with the potential for excellence. They are headed by number 1 ranked Dean Heil (133) of Ohio, number 3 ranked Anthony Collica (149) of Ohio, number 3 ranked Keilan Torres (157) of Oklahoma, number 7 ranked Zac Gentzler (125) of Kansas, number 15 ranked Eli Hale (125) of Oklahoma, and number 27 ranked Davey Dolan (141) of Oklahoma. A talented transfer student from Bucknell University is 2012 NCAA qualifier Austin Miller (125).
- **6. NORTH CAROLINA STATE** Pat Popolizio enters his second year as head coach of the W olfpack after six years at

Binghamton University, where he transformed the Bear cats into a national contender. In his first full year of r ecruiting at N.C. State, Popolizio and Assistant Coach Frank Beasley have assembled an exceptional group of highly-decorated prospects to come on boar d. Headlining the list of newcomers ar e number 2 ranked Scott DelVecchio (133) of New Jersey, number 5 ranked Pete Renda (174) of Pennsylvania, number 9 ranked Peter Santos (174) of California, number 11 ranked Chris Wilkes (133) of Missouri, number 12 ranked Brenden Calas (125) of New Jersey, number 14 ranked Micah Per ez (125) of California, number 25 ranked Shayne Brady (184) of New York, and number 27 Michael Macchiavello (197) of North Car olina. Other incoming freshmen include Georgia state runner-up Marshall Brown (125), North Carolina state runner-up Mitch Goldbach (133), three-time Ohio state placer Max Rohskopf (141), W isconsin state placer Randy Shine (141), North Car olina state champions Jake DeAngelo (141), Rodney Shepard (157), and Jake Castagner o (197), four-time Virginia state champion Colby Dean (149), thr Virginia state champion Beau Donahue (149), three-time New Jersey state placer Brian Hamann (149), New York state placer Joe Mastr o (157), two-time Geor gia state champion Chad Pyke (165), New England champion Mikey Amorando (165), and West Virginia state champion Dylan Ceravalo (174). A multi-talented transfer student with the ability to help tr emendously is 2010 Pennsylvania state champion Nick Carr (149).

7. PENN STATE - Cael Sanderson, a 2004 Olympic champion, and the only undefeated (159-0) four -time NCAA champion in the history of the sport, led the tradition-rich Penn State University wrestling program to their thir d straight NCAA Championships crown last year in only his fourth season as head coach. He has developed a sterling national reputation and is poised to add to the list of 24 previous Nittany Lion wrestlers who have captured NCAA titles. The list of superstar performers include Howard Johnston, Joe Lemyre, Hud Samson, Larry Fornicola, Bill Oberly, John Johnston, Andy Matter, John Fritz, Carl DeStefanis, Scott Lynch, Sanshiro Abe, Jim Martin, Jeff Prescott, John Hughes, Kerry McCoy, Glenn Pritzlaff, Jeremy Hunter, Phil Davis, Quentin Wright, Frank Molinaro, David Taylor, and Ed Ruth. Highlighting this year 's recruiting class are four in-state Pennsylvania ranked pr ospects. They are number 1 Zain Retherford (141), number 7 Cody Law (165), number 7 Matt McCutcheon (197), and number 8 Garr et Hammond (157). A highprofile 2010 graduate with terrific skills is four-time Utah state champion Kade Moss (149). He enters the proogram after a two year Mormon Mission. T wo other in-state Pennsylvania pr ospects are Devon Bentley (133) and number 28 ranked P.J. Steinmetz (197).

8. NORTH DAKOTA STATE – Roger Kish, a former four time Michigan state high school champion and two-time NCAA All-American for the University of Minnesota, begins his third season as head coach of the North Dakota State University wrestling team. He has developed a fine reputation as a master motivator and energetic recruiter and is working diligently to push the Bison program to the upper echelon of Division I College wrestling. Kish brings in a highly-decorated recruiting class that will continue to inject new levels of excitement to the program. Leading the way ar e number 4 ranked Mitch Bengtson (141) of Minnesota, number 6 ranked Clayton Ream (149) of Missouri, number 7 ranked T irso Lara (125) of California, number 7 ranked Preston Lehmann (184) of North Dakota, number 13 ranked Tommy Peterson (197) of Minnesota, number 24 ranked Kyle Gliva (133) of Minnesota, number 25 ranked T revour Chavez (165) of Alaska, and number 26 ranked Mitch Friedman (141) of Wisconsin. Other exciting incoming fr eshmen include Wisconsin state runner-ups Joe Umlauf (133) and Tyler Weyer (149), Minnesota state runner-up Cole Sladek (149), Minnesota state champion Grant Nehring (157), three-time Missouri state placer Nick Olejnik (165), and Minnesota state placer Jerrad Nieland (285). T ransferring in from Old Dominion University is 2012 NCAAqualifier and two-time Minnesota state champion Justin LaValle (141). Another exceptional newcomer is 2010 graduate T yler Lehmann (197) of North Dakota. Lehmann, a previous three-time state champion and Junior National Greco-Roman All-American, will join the team after a stint at the Olympic Training Center.

9. OHIO STATE – Under the guidance of eighth-year Head Coach Tom Ryan and his outstanding coaching staff, the traditionally strong Ohio State Buckeyes have become a recruiting powerhouse and one of the premier teams in the nation. Eleven wrestlers have captured NCAA titles while proudly wearing OSU's school colors of Scarlet and Gray. They include Tommy Rowlands, Mitch Clark, Rex Holman, Mark Coleman, Jude Skove, Dave Reinbolt, George Bollas, George Downes, J Jaggers, Mike Pucillo, and Logan Stieber . This

They are four-time Ohio state champions Nathan Tomasello (125) and Bo Jordan (165). Two additional newcomers are number 25 ranked Jake Ryan (149) of Ohio and W est Virginia University transfer and 2009 Cadet National Fr eestyle Championships r unner-up Dominic Prezzia (165).

10. ILLINOIS – Eighteen wrestlers have won individual NCAA Championships while pr oudly competing for the University of Illinois Fighting Illini. They include Joe Sapora, Geor ge Minot, Joe Puerta, Ralph Silverstein, John Ginay , Allen Sapora, Archie Deutschman, David Shapir o, Larry T enpas, Bob Norman, Jon Llewellyn, Steve Marianetti, Ernest Benion, Eric Siebert, Carl Perry , John Lockhart, Adam Tirapelle, Matt Lackey, and Jesse Delgado. Fifth-year Head Coach Jim Hef fernan, Associate Head Coach Mark Perry, and Assistant Coach Jeremy Hunter combined their ef forts to bring in three valiant performers with illustrious backgr ounds and huge expectations. High school stars include number 2 ranked Isaiah Martinez (157) of California, number 2 ranked Br ooks Black (285) of New Jersey, and number 5 ranked Kyle Langenderfer (149) of Illinois.

11. NEBRASKA – Head Coach Mark Manning is a masterful, highly-respected recruiter who constantly attracts five-star talent from all acr oss the nation. Pr evious NCAA champions for the Huskers include Jor dan Burroughs, Paul Donahoe, Jason Powell, Brad Vering, Tolly Thompson, Tony Purler, Jason Kelber, Bill Scherr, Jim Scherr, and Mike Nissen. This year's outstanding recruiting class is led by four impact newcomers with a considerable amount of posthigh school experience and accolades. Five-time Minnesota state champion Destin McCauley (149) and 2011 Junior National Freestyle Championships winner Patrick Downey (184) of Maryland ar e pro-

lific 2011 high school graduates who enter the collegiate ranks after spending time at the Olympic Training Center. Two rugged transfer students are 2013 NCAA qualifier Eric Montoya (125) and 2012 National Junior College Championships winner Anthony Abidin (133). Other newcomers include number 17 ranked Colton McCrystal (133) of Iowa, Nebraska state placers Mitch Maginnis (125) and Alex Metzler (149), Nebraska state champions Eric Engler (174) and D.J. Castillo (285), and Wisconsin state champion Joey Dedick (197).

12. IOWA – Recognized within the legacy of wrestling circles across America as a highly-successful and dominant force on the collegiate wr estling scene, the University of Iowa continues its long-standing tradition of r espect and excellence. Some of the finest wrestlers to ever take to the collegiate mats have become legends at Iowa, including multiple NCAA champions Royce Alger, Ed Banach, Lou Banach, Terry Brands, Tom Brands, Chris Campbell, Barry Davis, Mark Ironside, Eric Juer gens, Marty Kistler, Randy Lewis, Terry McCann,

Matt McDonough, Jeff McGinness, Brent Metcalf, Lincoln McIlravy, Mark Perry, Joe Scarpello, Joe Williams, T.J. Williams, Chuck Yagla, and Jim Zalesky. Eighth-year Head Coach Tom Brands, a 1996 Olympic Gold Medalist, has led the Hawkeye's to three NCAA Championships crowns (2008, 2009, and 2010) and brings in another exceptional recruiting class. Leading the way are number 4 ranked Aaron Bradley (285) of Pennsylvania, number 7 ranked Jake Marlin (141) of Iowa, number 7 ranked Brandon Sorensen (149) of Iowa, and number 8 ranked Broc Berge (197) of Minnesota. A high-profile transfer student with immediate impact potential is two-time Iowa state champion Phillip Laux (125).

13. STANFORD - Historically, 16 Stanford wrestlers have combined their efforts for 23 All-American awards. The multi-talented group includes 2004 NCAA champion Matt Gentry, two-time NCAA runner-up Nick Amuchastegui, and All-Americans Len Bor chers, Terry Crenshaw, Chris Horpel, Doug Perkins, Jef f Wilson, Scott Wiggen, Dave Lee, Steve Buddie, Tod Surmon, Beau Weiner, Tanner Gardner, Josh Zupancic, Zack Giesen, and R yan Mango. For the fourth time in the last five years, Head Coach Jason Bor brought in an accomplished, highly-pr omising incoming freshman class with hopes of adding mor e grapplers to the impr essive All-American list. Headlining the group of newcomers are number 2 ranked Connor Schram (133) of Pennsylvania, number 3 ranked Nathan Butler (285) of Kansas, number 5 ranked Gar et Krohn (197) of Colorado, number 10 ranked T ommy Pawelski (125) of Illinois, and number 24 ranked Keaton Subjeck (165) of California. Another incoming freshman is California state qualifier Eric Cramer (125).

14. HARVARD – An exceptional force in the collegiate wrestling scene, Harvard University boasts a str ong tradition of excellence both athletically and academically . Former Crimson stars include NCAA champions, J.P. O'Connor, Jesse Jantzen, and John Harkness



Highly-respected Head Coach Jay Weiss brings in an exciting r ecruiting class that is led by number 2 ranked Eric Morris (184) of Pennsylvania, number 4 ranked Brad Perkins (133) of Missouri, number 5 ranked Tyler Grimaldi (165) of New York, and number 26 ranked Colby Knight (141) of Iowa. Three additional incoming freshmen are New York State Private School champion Zachary Dinan (141), Pennsylvania state placer Colton Peppelman (174), and Michigan state placer Samuel Ekanem (174).

15. OKLAHOMA – The Sooners have a storied, long-standing tradition of pr oducing exceptional wrestlers. Previous greats include NCAA champions Kendric Maple, T eyon Ware, Robbie Waller, Michael Lightner, Byron Tucker, John Kading, Melvin Douglas, Joe Reynolds, Dan Chaid, Dave Schultz, Mark Schultz, Andre Metzger, Keith Stearns, Rod Kilgore, Shawn Garel, Gary Breece, Mike Grant, Cleo McGlory, David McGuire, Wayne Wells, Greg Ruth, Jerry Stanley, Mike Sager, Mickey Martin, W ayne Baughman, Billy Carter, Dale Lewis, Duwayne Keller, George Goodner, Stan Abel, Paul Aubrey, Dick Delgado, Danny Hodge, Tommy Evans, Gordon Roesler, Bill Borders, Phil Smith, Har old Byrd, David C.

Matthews, Bill Keas, W ayne Martin, Harry Br oadbent, Vernon Sisney, Marion Foreman, Hardee Lewis, and Lawr ence Mantooth. 

16. RUTGERS – Scott Goodale enters his seventh year as the Rutgers University head wrestling coach and has brought the Scarlet Knights into the forefront of collegiate wrestling. With the influx of predominately homegrown New Jersey talent, Goodale continues to

bring in solid r ecruiting classes. Leading the way this year ar e number 2 ranked Anthony Ashnault (141) of New Jersey, number 6 ranked T yson Dippery (149) of Pennsylvania, number 9 ranked Cor ev Stasenko (133) of New Jersey, number 20 ranked Taylor Jackson (184) of Florida, and number 28 ranked Nick Gravina (157) of New Jersey. Other new r ecruits include Joshua Patrick (125) of Pennsylvania, Greg McCrystal (141) of New Jersey , Dylan , Mike Painton (149) of New Jersey Underwood (149) of Illinois, Garr ett Conner (184) of Ohio, and Anthony Messner (197) of New Jersey.

17. RIDER – For over 30 years, the Rider University wr estling program has enjoyed national r ecognition and success under Head Coach Gary T aylor. Previous All-American Broncs wrestlers include Lou DiSerafino, Tim Morrison, John Lucerne, Leo Giel, John Hangey , Adam Derangowski, Shawn Scannell, Jason Nase, Doug Umbehauer, John Carvalheira,



Francis Dunn, and Don Fisch. T aylor and Associate Head Coach John Hangey signed an exceptional recruiting class that will provide a foundation for futur e success. Headlining the list of newcomers are number 2 ranked B.J. Clagon (1 41) of New Jersey , number 10 ranked J.R. Wert (125) of V irginia, and number 14 ranked W ayne Stinson (149) of New Jersey . Four other solid in-state New Jersey prospects are Johnny Gentile (125), Zach V alcarce (125), Andrew Reca (157), and Ali Yildiz (184). Transferring in from Old Dominion University is 2013 NCAA qualifier Robert Deutsch (125).

18. PRINCETON – Head Coach Chris Ayres and Assistant Coach Sean Gray did a phenomenal job by signing a host of multitalented performers with numer ous state and national accolades to their credit. Heading the list of highly-touted incoming fæshmen are number 3 ranked Ray O'Donnell (197) of Pennsylvania, number 6 ranked Brett Harner (174) of Pennsylvania, number 1 1 ranked Trey Aslanian (125) of New York, number 16 ranked Jor dan Laster (133) of Illinois, and number 20 ranked Matthew Gancayco (165) of Maryland. Two additional exceptional newcomers are two-time National Prep Championships placer Troy Murtha (174) of Maryland and Ohio state champion Jake Moore (285).

19. MINNESOTA – With 27 years as the head coach of the Golden Gophers, J Robinson has built a legacy of excellence ar ound the University of Minnesota wrestling program. NCAA champions developed and mentored by Robinson include Marty Mor gan, Tim Hartung, Brock Lesnar, Luke Becker, Jared Lawrence, Damion Hahn, Cole Konrad, Dustin Schlatter, Jayson Ness, and Tony Nelson. With the signing of a fine group of incoming freshmen, the proud Minnesota program will continue to flourish. The class features number 3 ranked Nick Wanzek (174) of Minnesota, number 7 ranked Jake Short (149) of Minnesota, number 18 ranked Judson Preskitt (125) of Pennsylvania, and number 19 ranked Nate Thomas (125) of Minnesota. Two other in-state Minnesota recruits are state placers Chris Pfarr (157) and Jordan Rothers (165).

20. SOUTH DAKOTA STATE - Former Iowa State

University NCAA champion Chris Bono officially took over as head coach of the South Dakota State University wr estling program in the spring of 2012. He is quickly moving the Jackrabbits program into the national spotlight bringing in a sterling group of incoming fr eshmen owning impressive credentials. The recruiting crop is headed by number 5 ranked Paul Mascarenas (125) of New Mexico, number 8 ranked Colin Holler (165) of Illinois, and number 9 ranked Nate Rotert (197) of South Dakota. Dalton Moran (149), Illinois state champion Jake T urk (184), Iowa state champion Matthew Seabold (184), Iowa state placer Alex Macki (197), and North Carolina state champion Chaas Delgado (285).

21. VIRGINIA – Steve Garland, a former NCAA runner-up at the University of Virginia, enters his eighth season as the head coach of his alma mater. He has developed a fine r eputation as a master motivator and energetic recruiter and has worked diligently to push the Cavaliers to among the nation's elite. Head Coach Tom Minkel brings in an exciting incoming freshman class that is highlighted by four decorated performers. 25T. UTAH VALLEY – Greg Williams, a former California state high school champion and NCAA All-American for Utah State University, begins his eighth season as head coach at Utah Valley University. He has taken Wolverine grapplers to the NCAA Championships in each of the past five sea-

Romano and Assistant Coach Anthony Ralph signed five highly-r egarded high school standouts with accomplished backgrounds. They are number 7 ranked Ivan McClay (125) of Ohio, number 8 ranked Jonas Gaytan (125) of California, number 19 ranked Garr ett Lineberger (182) of Maryland, number 20 ranked Kyle Sether (133) of Or egon, and number 20 ranked Michael Burkhar dt (285) of Minnesota. Other tough incoming freshmen include Ohio state r unner-up Joey Miller (125), Ohio state placers Zon Fields (125) and Anthony Craig (133), Virginia state placer Aaron Bright (133), four-time Michigan state placer Hunter Machus (133), Indiana state placer Tyler Hupp (141), Florida state runner-up Jayden Semrad (149), and Ohio state qualifiers Lee Wilson (141) and Tyrone McGuinea (152). Eight exceptional transfer students with the ability to help tr emendously are three-time National Pr ep Championships placers Jacob Goodwin (125) and Andrew Bannister (133), California State Community College Championships winner Abel Avila (141), Ohio state champions T ucker Armstrong (149) and Mitch Newhouse (157), two-time Illinois state champion Gage Harrah (197), two-time Ohio state placer Irayel W illiams (197), and National Junior College Championships runner-up Yaseen Mudasser (285).
