Terukina, Carr Set for NWCA All-Star Classic

AMES, Iowa – No. 19 [Kysen Terukina](#) and No. 3 [David Carr](#) are in Austin, Texas to compete at the National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA) All-Star Classic Tuesday at 7 p.m.

Terukina, a late addition to the event, will take on Minnesota's No. 4 Pat McKee in the first match of the event. Terukina is a two-time NCAA qualifier while McKee is a three-time qualifier and two-time All-American.

Carr will square off with Princeton's Quincy Monday, who is ranked first at 157 pounds, in a highly anticipated 165-pound bout. Carr is a three-time NCAA qualifier with three All-American finishes, including a national title, to his name. Monday is a three-time NCAA qualifier, two-time All-American and was a finalist at 157 pounds last season.

"I'm super excited for this match," Carr said. "Quincy Monday is a competitor. I just want to go throw it all out there and have some fun. This is a match that everyone wants to see, it's been awhile since we've had a Carr-Monday match."

This will be the first clash between Carr and Monday on the mat, but their fathers, Nate Carr and Kenny Monday, were rivals in their college days. Nate, a three-time national champion for the Cyclones in the early 1980s, defeated Kenny in overtime for two of his titles. Nate went on to win a 68kg bronze medal at the 1988 Olympics while Kenny won gold at 74kg.

"I grew up talking about, watching, hearing everything about Carr vs. Monday," Carr said. "It doesn't happen too often where you have two sons wrestling at a high level, who are both credentialed. There is so much legacy in our families. It gets me excited just talking about it."

The NWCA All-Star Classic is back after a four-year hiatus and includes five NCAA Champions on the card.
